How I use these websites:

- ❖ **Websites 1, 2, 3, 4 & 5 have similar functions.** It really comes down to your preference. Each website stores this information differently, so you have to explore the website until you are comfortable.
 - They are helpful when researching a single company or comparing a company with its competitor. When logging on to one of the first five websites you will have to enter a ticker symbol of a company.
 - **The following information can be found once you enter the ticker symbol of a company.**

Stock Price	Beta	Headlines
Volume	P/E	Charts
52 Week High/Low	Dividend/Yield	Interactive Charts
Annual Report	Institutional Holdings	Financials

Website # 6 (cnbc) I use to find Video recordings from **CEO interviews** and **Analyst interviews**.

Website # 7 is a **Barron's blog** with current news headlines of companies.
